At the beginning of 1943 the Boy Scouts served one out of every 6.5 boys in the County. Today they serve one out of every 2.8 boys (12, 13, 14, 15 years of age). Their membership alone amounts to 443 men and boys in the county compared to 136 fifteen months ago.

Scouting and Campfire in Douglas County have accepted the challenge to expand and serve every boy and girl who wishes to join.



The Oregon Trail Council consists of all Boy Scout work in Lane, Douglas, Benton, Lincoln, Coos, and Curry counties.

Problems of juvenile delinquency have mounted in every community in America since the start of the war.
