Legionnaires Want Ickes To Quit as WRA Chief

LOS ANGELES, April 17—(AP)—American Legionnaires, attending a California department executive committee meeting here, have asked Harold L. Ickes to resign as War Relocation authority chief. The resolution quoted remarks, which it attributed to Ickes, in defense of WRA policies concerning Japanese evacuated from the Pacific coast area.

Adopted yesterday, the resolution declares Ickes placed the problem of Japanese rehabilitation upon California, Washington and Oregon, and quoted him as stating April 13 that, "to a large extent it is their problem to see that Japanese evacuees are restored to normal living soon after the war ends."
