PORTLAND, Ore., April 20—(AP)—The hull of the historic battleship Oregon, focal point of a stormy controversy since it was partly scrapped, will return again to Portland where it lay for many years, an object of patriotic veneration. Now at the Port of Kalama, Wash., it will be brought to a Portland shipyard, probably some day this week, to be prepared for conversion for navy use, said Lt. (jg) Richard Stanton, navy public relations officer.

Nazis Cooperate in Aid to Prisoners via Red Cross

PORTLAND, April 18.—(AP)—The German government cooperates fully with the Red Cross in distributing packages to American prisoners of war and better Japanese cooperation is expected, Mrs. Grace B. Holmes said today. The National Red Cross staff member said each man in German camps receives one package a week, containing food and necessary clothing and toilet articles. Three ships operate between this country and Marseilles, France, for the sole purpose of carrying supplies to prisoners, Mrs. Holmes told interviewers. Eighty-eight per cent of the packages shipped on the exchange ship Gripsholm last September have been distributed to Americans in Japanese prison camps, she said.

Territorial Bond Found Too Late to Get \$5,180

BOISE, Idaho, April 20.—(AP)—The \$500 Idaho territorial bond found in old papers in St. Louis, Mo., would have been worth \$5,180 today, the Idaho treasurer said. A. C. Quinn wrote Mrs. Beatty asking if the 12 per cent bond issued at "Boise City, Idaho, April 20, 1866," was still valid. A search of old records disclosed that the original owner had filed an affidavit of loss in 1870 and received payment.

Grocery Delivery Halt Will Continue After War

PORTLAND, April 20.—(AP)—Credit and grocery deliveries will remain curtailed after the war, the Oregon Food Merchants association agreed at a discussion here last night. The group predicted a great postwar increase in use of plastic and glass containers, frozen foods, and packaged fresh meats.
