SPECIAL SCHOOL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that in the school election to be held on Wednesday, April 26, 1944, in the Junior High School building in Roseburg, Oregon, the following proposal will be submitted to the qualified voters of School District No. 4, Douglas county, Oregon:

Shall the School Board of School District No. 4, of Douglas county, be authorized to make a levy of six mills annually for five years beginning July, 1944, to provide a fund for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, betterment, repair or rehabilitation of schools, school plants and school premises, in order to provide more adequately for the public school population of said district, the estimated total cost of which will be \$150,000.00 and to use state or federal matching funds should they become available, which levies shall be outside the limitation imposed by ARTICLE XI, Section 11 of the Oregon Constitution.

Section 111-910 O. C. L. A. provides that any citizen of the state of Oregon who is twenty-one years of age and has resided in the district thirty days immediately preceding the election and has property in the district as shown by the last county assessment on which he or she is liable or subject to pay a tax shall be entitled to vote in this election. The property qualification shall be deemed to have been complied with if the elector shall present to the election board satisfactory evidence that he or she has stock, shares, or ownership in any corporation, firm or co-partnership which has property in the district on which a tax is paid as shown by the last county assessment.

The polling place will be open for the receiving of votes from 2:00 o'clock until 7:00 o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday, April 26, 1944.

BOOK 4—Blue stamps, A8 through K8, valid indefinitely. Blue stamps L8 through Q8, valid indefinitely, beginning May 1.

MEAT, BUTTER, FATS AND CHEESE
BOOK 4—Red stamps A8 through K8 valid indefinitely. Red stamps R8, S8, T8 valid indefinitely beginning May 7. Red stamps U8, V8, W8 valid indefinitely beginning May 21.

SUGAR
BOOK 4: Sugar stamp 30 valid for 5 pounds indefinitely. Sugar stamp 31 valid for 5 pounds indefinitely beginning April 1.

FOR CANNING ONLY: Sugar stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through Feb. 28, 1945. Apply at local OPA
