LIONEL SCHETKY, superintendent of the Sutherlin operation of the Springfield Plywood corporation, recently was elected a director of the Pacific Logging congress. A member of a well known Portland sawmill and logging firm, he has 35 years of sawmill and logging experience to his credit.

"I started in at \$2.50 a day," he told me, "and those were about the happiest days of my life."

Mr. Schetky's outfit employs anywhere from 140 to 180 men in the Sutherlin mill and in the woods 14 miles east of Sutherlin. The monthly payroll approximates \$35,000. The timber holdings amount to 5,000 acres, and one may be reasonably sure that each 40 of the tract is reasonably heavily timbered with a type of tree which the company wants.

Timber from Mr. Schetky's company is contract-hauled to the mill by Orville Smith, Lee Mortensen and Fred Holloman, whose big trucks carry maximum loads of both sawlogs and peels.

The latter are shipped to the company mill at Springfield, Oregon. The sawlogs are manufactured into lumber at the Sutherlin mill of the company, one which cuts approximately 100,000 feet daily.

Lots of water has filled quite a few log ponds since that memorable day in Sutherlin, many years ago, long remembered by certain Sutherlin residents, when I turned a corner in front of Mark "Baldie's" bank and discovered a dog sleeping peacefully in the middle of the street. He hadn't been disturbed there for hours.

As I stopped my car, with screeching brakes, honking my horn impatiently, that dog did come to life, but slowly and with exceeding dignity! He stretched himself, yawned prodigiously, walked over to the car, smelled the tires languidly, then did— you know what. After which he returned to his warm spot on the pavement and laid right down and went to sleep again.

I had to back up half a block to get out of town.

Draft Evasion Charge Hits Local Truck Driver

Elmer Hartle, 29, employed in Roseburg as a truck driver, was taken into custody today on a charge of draft evasion, Sergeant Paul Morgan of the state police reported. Hartle's arrest was made, Morgan said, on a warrant issued out of the federal court at Portland. He was reported to have been called for induction in South Dakota.

Death Toll in Montreal Bomber Crash Reaches 15

MONTREAL, April 26—(AP)—Smoke still rose today from the shattered block of tenement houses in downtown Montreal where a

Liberator bomber crashed yesterday, killing at least 15 persons. The RAF plane had just taken off for a trans-Atlantic flight.

Those killed were the five crew members, a policeman, and nine tenement residents, including an 18-month-old baby. One man was listed as missing and three other persons were injured critically. Four of the known dead were women whose homes collapsed when the plane struck and exploded.

Investigators seeking the cause of the accident found only a fragment of wing, a piece of the tail assembly and the shattered parts of the plane's engines.
