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Appeal For Low Income Class Made

Abandonment of Wage Control Asked in Senate Report: OPA Praised

WASHINGTON, April 28.—(AP)—Abandonment of federal wage controls over incomes up to \$150 a month for single workers and \$200 for family heads was urged today by a special senate committee which pictured 20,000,000 persons in white collar and low income groups as living now "between subsistence and privation."

The subcommittee headed by Senator Pepper (D-Fla.) recommended that the War Labor board relax the little steel formula to allow employers to raise salaries or wages up to those levels without WLB approval.

In addition, the group called for increased funds for the OPA to enforce more rigid price controls and check "the present inflationary trend."

Listing clerks, teachers, stenographers, local government employees, pensioners and veterans' dependents as among those hardest hit by increased living costs, the report said that for them "inflation has already begun."

"The OPA has done good work by keeping prices within some kind of limits, especially during the last year, but it has been denied the funds and personnel needed to do its job effectively," the report said. "The result has been a slow, creeping inflation which, unless it is checked, carries with it the promise of future chaos."

Low Salaries Cited
The report held that a \$50 a week salary for a family head left only a "very narrow margin of living" under present price conditions, whereas millions are subsisting on incomes at or near half that level.

As examples, the subcommittee cited social security board figures showing more than 2,000,000 local government employees averaged \$28.85 weekly in October, 1943; 4,500,000 so-called "white collar" workers were paid \$28.69 in 1943; over 1,000,000 teachers received over 1,000,000 teachers received school year, and that 4,500,000 recipients of old age and dependency awards received far less, an average of \$26.46 monthly in the case of old age aid.

Although the labor department index has indicated a 23.4 per cent living cost rise in the last three years, the committee said it believed the actual increase was greater than that.

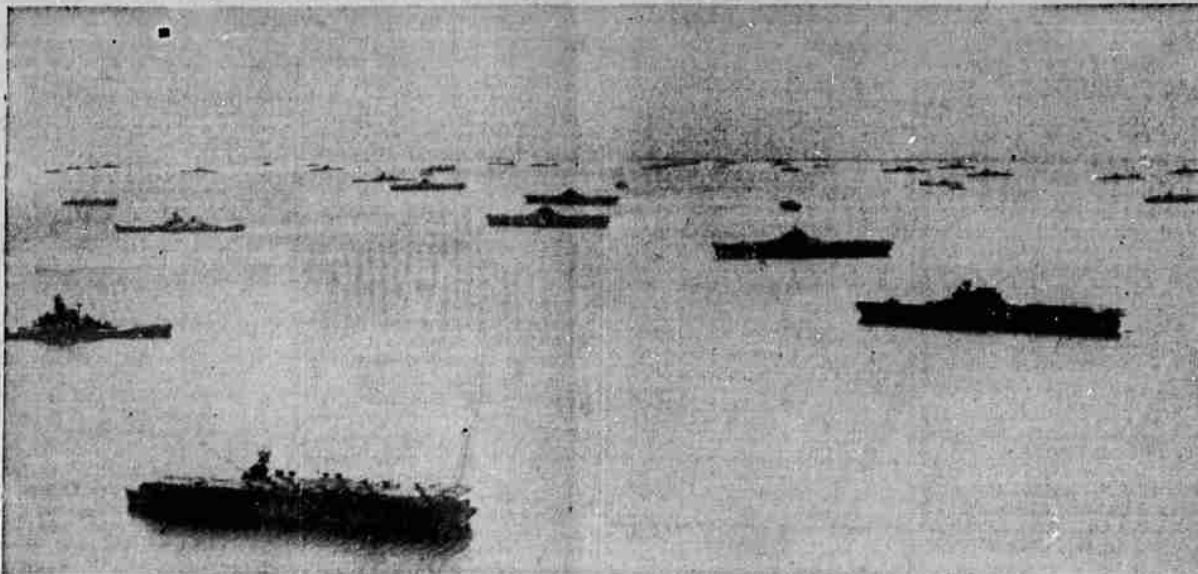
