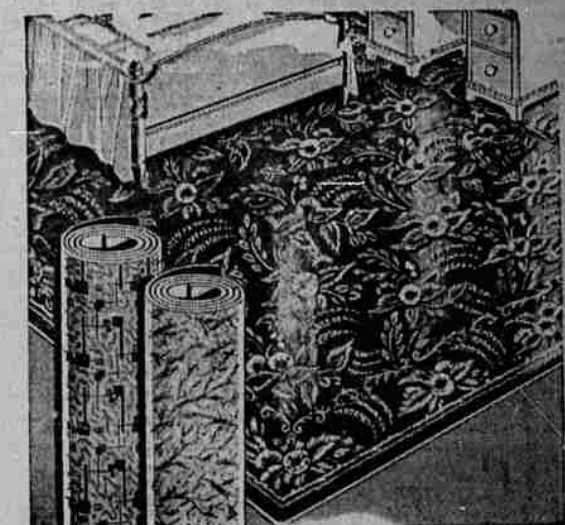
Fall From Train Kills Camp Adair Soldier

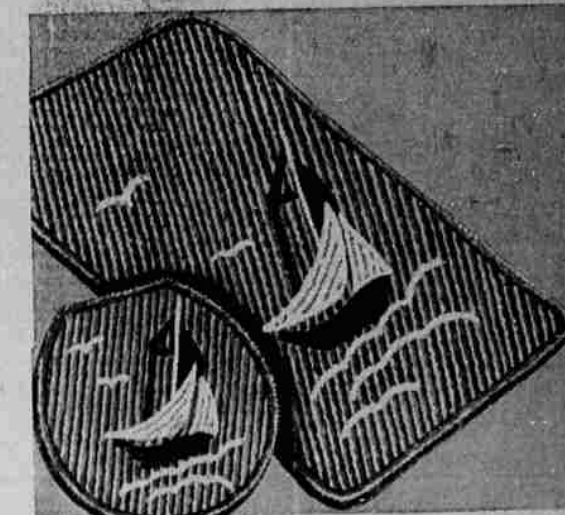

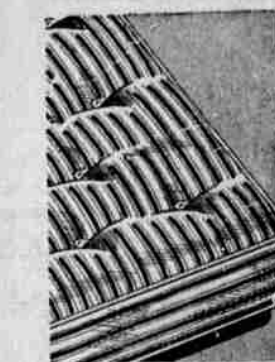
