PORTLAND, May 12. (AP)—Ceiling price for Oregon strawberry growers is \$1.62 a 12-cup crate, W. H. McCargar, head of the district OPA food section, said yesterday.

The crate on which the price is based must contain a minimum of 144 ounces—12 ounces to the cup. The ceiling is f. o. b. county shipping point.

The ceiling applies to both Oregon and Washington. Slightly different prices prevail in both areas.

Nylon Role Vital In Jungle Warfare

JERSEY CITY, N. J., May 11. (AP)—Nylon, a wartime civilian casualty missed by millions of American women, is now serving the army in 12 important G. I. items, a recent survey of the quartermasters corps revealed.

To show the feminine population their sacrifice of the super-hosiery was "truly worthwhile," the New Jersey quartermaster depot issued today a report of nylon at war.

On the jungle front, where dampness and humidity plague the Yank soldiers, nylon provides ponchos for shelter tents, rain coats, foxhole covers and moisture-proof bedding rolls. Quick drying qualities of the synthetic nylon, the quartermaster corps found, make it superior to other materials.

Nylon netting protects soldiers in swinging hammocks from the onslaught of hungry insects which formerly ate through cotton screens.

The army's service forces have brought nylon shoe laces to the battle front to replace cotton laces in army boots, and nylon is used in the fabric uppers of jungle boots instead of canvas.

The army reports nylon laces "proving so excellent in being moisture and mildew resistant, tough and long-wearing, that they are now used in practically all army shoes."
