Ceiling Prices On Lumber to Go Up, Cordon Advised

WASHINGTON, May 18—(AP)—Senator Guy Cordon, after a conference with OPA officials, announced that OPA is preparing a new order designed to effect upward modification in ceiling prices on remanufactured lumber.

Senator Cordon had received complaints from Oregon companies that ceiling prices were discriminatory and threatened seriously to curtail remanufacturing operations. New OPA regulation will set a new base price for one remanufacturing operation with increased rates for two or more operations, and increases for box car handling charges in connection with kiln dry lumber.

Lumber remanufacturers cooperate with sawmills which do not have sufficient drying and remanufacturing equipment or none at all in production of crating boards critically needed by the government for military shipments.

At present crating is consuming more than one-third of the nation's lumber output. Remanufacturers have asserted that OPA ceilings allowed them only \$3.50 to \$4 for an operation, while sawmills obtained \$5.50 to \$7.50 for resawing only. The ceilings did not represent costs in many instances and threatened to greatly curtail the supply of boards.

Policies of Oregon Cities on Program At League's Meet

City officials of Oregon will gather in Portland May 25 and 26 for the third wartime conference of the League of Oregon Cities, W. F. Harris, mayor of Roseburg announced today. The conference is expected to draw city officials from all parts of the state for discussion of war and postwar problems and policies of Oregon cities.

Featured speakers at the conference will be Earl D. Mallory of Chicago, executive director of the American Municipal Association; David L. Simpson, president of the Portland Chamber of Commerce and chairman of the Portland area postwar development committee; State Senator Merle R. Chessman of Astoria, and Mayor R. Earl Riley of Portland. Special section meetings are scheduled on Thursday morning for municipal utility managers, city attorneys, and for officials interested in planning and zoning in the suburban areas, and for those interested in the enforcement or adoption of building codes. A tour of community centers has also been arranged by the Portland Housing authority on Tuesday morning for city officials who are planning to develop community center facilities as a part of their postwar program.

Among the subjects listed for discussion at the general sessions are budgeting, budget publication, financial reserves, retirement of public employees, enabling legislation for planning and

zoning in the suburban areas, preliminary steps in the construction of sewage disposal plants, juvenile delinquency, local postwar planning programs and municipal revenue problems and practices.

National 4-H Congress To Be Held as Usual

CORVALLIS, Ore., May 18—(AP)—The annual 4-H club congress in Chicago will be held this fall as usual, H. C. Seymour, state 4-H club leader and a member of the national committee in charge of planning the congress, said today.

Importance of the congress in 4-H club war work is so widely recognized among government wartime agencies that special consideration is given to insure its continuance, Seymour said.

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
