Doughboys' Speed Crushes Nazis in Battle of Formia

FORMIA, Italy, May 19—(AP)—Retreating nazis threw all the fire power they had against on-rushing Americans who captured Formia—a Tyrrhenian seaport believed to be the coastal anchor of the Adolf Hitler line—but they could not even slow the doughboys down.

Germans loaded the route with obstacles from Sauri, three and a half miles to the east, all the way along coastal highway No. 7 to the westernmost corner of Formia.

There were fortified pillboxes, deep dugouts, mines by the hundreds on land and in the waters off shore and snipers gitting death from every house. To keep things hopping, long range artillery crunched in from the power-house at Gaeta every little while, covering every yard. Gaeta is getting it back from our guns now.

Huge piles of supplies and war materials were left by Germans in their hurried evacuation of the town. Nearly 200 prisoners were taken, but most of these were snipers. The Germans expended comparatively few men here.

In one building alone there were 150 cases of ammunition nearby where mortars still set up ready to fire, indicating just how fast the Germans got out of town.

Despite the German defense, it took the Americans just 24 hours from the time they entered Formia to the moment when they broke into the last house on the last street and rounded up the last sniper.

All along the road and in the town there was evidence of the nazis' unsuccessful effort to delay the Americans. One German dugout was built completely underneath highway No. 7.

Wrecked vehicles and tanks, both American and German, were scattered every hundred yards or so. Some were the victims of mines some were hit by artillery and some were caught in machinegun fire.

Once-Burned Transport Now Model of Security

WASHINGTON, May 18—(AP)—The navy transport Wakefield, bombed heavily by the Japanese while evacuating women and children from Singapore, and subsequently burned to her hull in the Atlantic while carrying American troops, is back at sea, moving men to the fighting fronts.

The navy told today of her return to duty under command of Capt. Roy L. Raney, coast guard, Marblehead, Mass., who was executive officer when the Wakefield took refugees from Singapore.

More than 1,500 persons were rescued from the Wakefield, the former \$10,000,000 luxury liner Manhattan, when she partially burned in the Atlantic in September, 1942.

When she was recommissioned recently, the navy said, she went to sea with so many safety features built into her that her coast guard crew now call her "the floating lifejacket."
