Prompt Repair Advised to Meet Farm Truck Lack

The individual farmer's part in a statewide effort to prevent a crisis in farm transportation is to take the best possible car of his present truck, car, tractor or other equipment. This fact was emphasized at all of the district farm transportation meetings, 12 of which were held throughout the state to mobilize all resources for getting this year's crops to market.

The meetings represented a joint effort of the Office of Defense Transportation, the OPA, the AAA, and the O. S. C. Extension service, in cooperation with parts dealers, repair men, and farm organizations.

The situation is so critical that only the coordinated efforts of all individuals and agencies will insure adequate handling of this year's crops, according to information presented at these meetings. While normally 600,000 new trucks are put into service each year in the entire country, only 30,000 will be available this year. To keep old trucks running the number of parts planned to be available this year is about twice the normal supply.

The OPA representatives reported the seriousness of the tire and gas situation but said that farmers will get every gallon of gasoline they need, although every effort will be made to prevent oversupply, diversion, or waste. County war boards will, in some instances, work with ration boards in passing upon farm applications for gas.

The ODT has established a special maintenance division to help obtain parts promptly that cannot be supplied by local dealers. It is also planning to help relieve emergency situations where a particular harvest job cannot be handled by the available supply of local trucks. The state public utilities commission and the state police are cooperating in arranging methods by which farm-owned trucks can be rented or loaned for operation by neighbors.

RATIONING CALENDAR

(Clip and keep for handy reference.)

PROCESSED FOODS
BOOK 4—Blue stamps AS through Q8, valid indefinitely. MEAT, BUTTER, FATS AND CHEESE

BOOK 4—Red stamps AS through T8 valid indefinitely. Red stamps U8, V8, W8 valid indefinitely beginning June 3.

SUGAR

BOOK 4—Sugar stamps 30 and 31 valid indefinitely, 5 pounds each.

FOR CANNING ONLY—Sugar stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through February 28, 1945. Apply at local OPA board for more.

SHOE: Loose stamps invalid. BOOK 3—Airplane stamps Nos. 1 and 2 valid indefinitely, one pair each.

GASOLINE COUPONS: Not valid unless endorsed. "A" No. 11 valid through June 21, 3 gallons each. (May renew "B" or "C" within but not before 15 days from date on cover.)

JUNE 21—Expiration date of No. 11 "A" coupons. (May renew B or C coupons within but not before 15 days from date on cover.)

FUEL OIL
SEPTEMBER 20—Expiration date of period 4 and 5 coupons.

STOVES
Purchasers must get certificates at ration boards for most WOOD, SAWDUST, COAL. Fuel dealers deliver by priorities new stoves.

Coupons must be endorsed as soon as received—your protection against the black market.

PRICE CONTROL
Refer price inquiries and complaints to the price clerk of your local war price and rationing board.

TIRE INSPECTION
Tire inspection no longer required, but tire inspection records are needed to get special gasoline allotments, tire replacements, etc.

NOTICE
The 1930 and prior years tax must be paid in full before August 15, to benefit by the cancellation of interest.

This rule applies to all those properties in which the taxes have been taken under the payment plan in which a fourth of the oldest year's tax is paid each year.
