Blacklist of Swedish Firms Will Be Increased

WASHINGTON, May 23—(AP)—The government's blacklist control committee studied the records of dozens of Swedish firms and business men today with a prospect of adding new names to the list, as American negotiators in the Scandinavian country pressed for a halt on all ball-bearing shipments from Sweden to Germany.

The state department announced last night the addition of 38 Swedish firms or individuals to the proclaimed list to be issued on June 2. The announcement added significantly, "the names of other firms are currently under consideration for inclusion."
