North-South Vow Of Unity Voiced on Gettysburg Field

Gettysburg, Pa., May 30—(AP)—Representatives of the north and south clasped hands on hallowed Gettysburg battlefield today and joined in a solemn pledge of unity and loyalty.

The nations' governors took time from the business of their 36th conference to join in tribute to the men who fell here in the decisive conflict of the war between the states.

Governor Edward Martin of Pennsylvania called it "the most important Memorial day service held on that field" since Lincoln's dedication of the national cemetery 81 years ago.

Speaking for the south, Governor J. Melville Broughton of North Carolina said:

"We are assembled here before a shrine sacred to the north and south alike. It is altogether fitting that these great sections of our nation, once divided but now united, should in this momentous hour of world history join in a solemn pledge of unity and loyalty."

And for the north, Governor Leverett Saltonstall of Massachusetts: "The handclasp here of north and south is proof that our country is no longer divided. The fact that the great grandsons of the boys in blue and gray are fighting side by side in all corners of the world indicates the united spirit of that nation."

The governors paraded with townspeople over the same Gettysburg route followed by Lincoln and stopped to watch school children decorate the graves of the 3,604 killed in the battle of Gettysburg.
