

Yankees' Drive on Biak Isle Halted By Bad Weather

ADVANCED ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, New Guinea, June 1—(AP)—Deprived by bad weather of vital air support, Yank invaders of Biak broke off momentarily their violent bid for three airfields but headquarters disclosed today they already have killed 679 Japanese and control the eastern part of that Schouten Island.

The full was expected to continue until such time as snipers and small scattered forces hiding in ridges along a road to the Mokmer airfield are cleaned out. That will permit the Americans to advance without fear of attacks on the right flank which have stopped the main force short of their first objective.

The invasion of Biak, in north Dutch New Guinea's Geelvink bay, opened Saturday at Bosnek near the island's southeastern tip and headquarters said today that all enemy opposition there has collapsed.

Many of the enemy dead were counted after the Yanks repulsed bitter counter-attacks Monday before Mokmer field. Two of these were reported belatedly today. It also was made known that "there were some casualties among our tanks" in Monday's fighting. Previously the destruction of eight enemy tanks and the disabling of three others had been reported.

Two hundred miles down the Dutch New Guinea coast at Mafin bay, Japanese were thwarted in an attempt to cut communication lines of another American invasion force.

Today's communique list of limited air actions included 60-ton bombings of Wewak, British New Guinea, and Rabaul, New Britain, a 33-ton long range attack by Admiralty-based bombers on Samar on the approaches to Truk and patrol stabs at Truk and Woleai, all in the Carolines.

Mexican Toilers Eager for Service In United States

GUADALAJARA, Mexico, June 1—(AP)—Swarms of hungry country laborers still throng the streets of this city in the hope of being sent to work on the farms and railroads of the United States.

The government of the state of Jalisco has notified them that no more migratory workers will be sent from this region until next August and advised them to return to their homes, but their number has not diminished.

WASHINGTON, June 1—(AP)—The war manpower commission said today that it was arranged to bring 1,000 workers to the United States from British Honduras to combat the manpower shortage in the lumber industry.

MEXICO CITY, June—(AP)—Mexican workers in the United States have increased the sympathy of that country for Mexico, while the workers themselves have grown more ambitious as a result of their stay, Labor Minister Curria told a press conference yesterday.

The minister has just returned from an inspection of the railroad track workers in four eastern states.

WINTER PEAS PROGRAM

To provide for a regular carry-over of seed to encourage planting in Southern States, WFA will offer producers \$5 per hundredweight for standard-quality Austrian winter peas seed produced in 1944. Handlers in the producing area may receive \$5.40 per hundredweight under the program for seed meeting shipping requirements. Certification will be required from dealers that producers were paid at least the basic producer price for each component lot in the shipment.
