Carpenter Ant Control Told In O. S. C. Bulletin

Oregon buildings are seldom attacked by regular wood-eating termites, although some suffer material damage from insects commonly known as carpenter ants, sometimes confused with termites, reports R. L. Furniss, federal entomologist who has conducted experiments on the control of these insects in cooperation with the agricultural experiment station at O. S. C. Furniss's findings have just been published in the form of station circular 158, "Carpenter Ant Control in Oregon." Carpenter ants are the familiar large black ants that commonly mine in logs, stumps and hollow trees. When they forsake those natural habitations and invade houses or other buildings, they provide themselves with living quarters by burrowing into the timbers, even though they do not eat the wood, as true termites do, according to Furniss. Besides being destructive, carpenter ants are also a nuisance when they are in and around houses through their habit of crawling over food and other articles.
