

# Initial Invasion Goal Won, but Job Ahead is Harder

(By JOHN M. HIGHTOWER) WASHINGTON, June 7—(AP)—The first crisis of the invasion ended in allied victory today. The second and final crisis has yet to develop.

That is the reason Washington officials from President Roosevelt down are tempering their optimism with cautious words about the next few days.

The president told a press conference late yesterday that western front operations were "up to schedule"; that American naval losses up to noon had been two destroyers and a tank landing ship and that losses of the airborne force had been one per cent of the force involved.

But, he said, he hopes the country will not become overconfident and he went on to emphasize his view that even this first operation isn't over. You just don't land on the beaches and walk in, he said. There has to be a lot of hard fighting. How "Wall" Shapes Up

From the tactical viewpoint it is one continuous push to expand the beachheads and broaden the local fronts into a single huge line of attack, but strategically it shapes up somewhat differently in this way:

The Germans, as their name "west wall" implied, planned their defense from Holland to the Bay of Biscay. As a fixed defense in this area they set up a belt of strong-point defenses—known on the Russian front as "hedgehogs"—running up to 25 to 40 miles deep.

To the "Wall," because of its vast size, they were compelled to commit most, possibly almost all, of the 54 or more divisions they had available for the channel coast.

According to their own pre-invasion broadcasts they held back a few, highly mobile panzer divisions to counter-attack wherever the allied spearheads appeared most threatening.

First Resistance Falls This system of defense depends for its success either on stopping the attack literally on the beaches, which is what the Germans tried to do most of yesterday, or on trapping the spearheads in the defense belt to prevent any major breakthrough.

Once it can be overcome General Eisenhower should be relatively free to exploit his position toward his first main objective which must be to establish his forces on such a large and fluid front that the enemy will be unable to force a stalemate.

# Jubilant Russia Moving Forces to Smash Germans

(By EDDY GILMORE) MOSCOW, June 7—(AP)—Russia is prepared to throw the great weight of the red army into the growing offensive against Germany, Red Star, the soviet army newspaper, said today.

"A strong, mounting attack of all the armies of the united nations will be fully developed," Red Star said.

The great armies which at Teheran gave solemn promises not to make a separate peace are beginning to move forward for a meeting in Berlin, the newspaper added.

Muscovites got up early this morning to read the freshest invasion bulletins, despite one of the wildest nights of celebration during the war. Outside my window the radio is blaring forth the latest details, and the soviet press, in an unprecedented display, turned over whole pages to the momentous military operations Russia had long awaited.

All newspapers published a picture of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, the supreme commander of the allied expeditionary force.

Maj. Gen. Galaktionov, in Pravda, said: "bloodshed in the name of the common countries in the east, west and south will solidify even more the understanding of the great alliance."

"We are fascinated by the intrepidity of the fighters who stormed the coastal fortifications and the heroism of the parachutists who dropped in the rear."

There were parties celebrating the invasion all over the city last night, with singing in the streets a part of the gaiety. The Russians love occasions and this was one they had been awaiting for months.

By early evening all the vodka had disappeared from commercial stores, where prices for this commodity are high.

# Praise Bestowed By Eisenhower on Success of Aides

SUPREME HEADQUARTERS Allied Expeditionary Force June 8—(AP)—Gen. Eisenhower declared today his "complete confidence in the ability of the allied armies, navies and air forces to do all they are asked to do has been completely justified."

"In the early landing operations which are always naval, the two allied navies—together with elements of navy units of the united nations—under Admiral Ramsay have excelled, in the high standard of their planning and their execution, any prior venture in which I have seen them engaged," Gen. Eisenhower said.

"The long and brilliant campaign conducted in the past month by the combined air forces including the commands of Air Chief Marshal Harris, Gen. Spaatz and Air Chief Marshal Leigh Mallory was an essential preliminary to the undertaking of the operation and has proved its effectiveness by the fact that the landing was made as planned. Their good work is continuing."

"Gen. Montgomery is in immediate and direct charge of all the assault ground forces. Under him all the troops are performing magnificently."

Warren Succeeds Hobson As Coach at U. of O.

EUGENE, Ore., June 8—(AP)—John A. Warren, duration football coach at the University of Oregon, has been named head basketball and baseball coach for the Webfoots during the 1944-45 seasons, according to an announcement made here today by

Anson B. Cornell, Oregon athletic manager.

Warren will replace Howard A. Hobson, who will attend Columbia university, New York City, to study for his doctor's degree on a sabbatical during this period. Hobson is scheduled to return in July of 1945.

"Honest John" is considered one of the best hoop mentors in the Pacific northwest. His teams at Astoria high school, before he came here some nine years ago as freshman coach, were perennial state championship contenders and copped many crowns at the Salem classic.

First-to-Land Soldier Makes Good on Promise

SYRACUSE, N. Y., June 8—(AP)—Mrs. Jane Lillyman of nearby Skaneateles knew all the time—well almost—that her husband, Capt. Frank Lillyman, would be the first allied soldier to set foot on French soil in the invasion from Britain.

A dispatch yesterday from a U. S. parachute carrier base said Lillyman was the first man to jump from the lead plane of the parachute troop carriers which went in before the assault from the sea.

Mrs. Lillyman said that in a recent letter her husband had written: "When the newspapers and radios blare out the news, remember that your pappy led the way."

From other letters Mrs. Lillyman had learned her husband was in charge of a "pathfinder" unit and his duties included "jumping in advance of other divisions."

# Kimmel-Short Trial Time Put On Extended Basis

WASHINGTON, June 7—(AP)—A senate-house conference committee compromised today on a six month's extension—until next December 7—of the time in which court martial proceedings might be instituted against Rear Admiral Husband E. Kimmel and Maj. Gen. Walter C. Short as a result of the Pearl Harbor catastrophe.

The present extension expires at midnight tonight.

Chairman Sumners (D-Tex.) of the house judiciary committee said action on the compromise would be sought in the house immediately. The senate must wait until the house acts before it can accept the compromise.

Instead of house provisions for a mandate to the secretaries of war and navy to begin court martial proceedings within the time specified, the conferees adopted more moderate language.

Following closely the provisions already approved by the senate, the compromise directs the two cabinet officers to make investigations within six months

Pour into sterilized jars, allowing 1/2-inch space for sealing with fresh paraffin. (NOTE: For Strawberry Jam, add 1/4 cup lemon juice to each 6 cups crushed berries.)

5 tps. cornstarch  
3/4 cup milk

1 cup raisins  
1/2 cup lemon juice  
1 tsp. grated lemon rind  
1 tsp. butter or margarine

Beat egg yolks slightly in top of double boiler; add 1 cup of the sugar and the cornstarch; mix well. Add milk gradually, stirring until smooth. Add raisins, lemon juice, and butter or margarine. Cook over rapidly boiling water about 15 minutes, or until thickened, stirring frequently. Cool; pour into baked 9-inch pastry shell; gradually add remaining sugar, beating until mixture holds peaks. Spread roughly on pie plate in moderate oven (350°F) 15 minutes, or until brown.
