Reported Plan to Oust Marion Senators Denied

SALEM, Ore., June 13.—(AP)—State Sen. Lew Wallace, democratic national committee man, said today he was misquoted in newspaper reports that he would bring suit to oust State Sens. John Carson and Frederick S. Lamport, both of Salem.

Wallace said he has no intention of bringing such a suit. The two senators were appointed by the Marion county court to succeed Sens. Allan G. Carson and Douglas McKay, both of whom entered the army.

Wallace said a suit would probably be necessary to place the names of democratic candidates, written in for the offices in the May primary, on the November ballot, since Attorney General Neuner has ruled that the interim appointments run until 1946.

"It would be a matter for the democratic party, however," he said. "I personally have neither the right nor the intention to file such a suit."

Strawberry Ceiling Prices Will Remain

PORTLAND, Ore., June 13.—(AP)—Ceiling prices on Oregon and Washington strawberries will remain as they are, at least for the time being.

Earl C. Haid, district OPA price executive, said the national OPA advised him there is "no present disposition" to change the price structure.

A growers' committee, headed by Morton Tompkins, master of the Oregon State grange, had urged removal of all price ceilings below the consumer level or raising of producer ceilings to the California-Idaho level.

Reich Little Crippled, Former Prisoner Says

NEW YORK, June 13.—(AP)—Larry Allen, Associated Press correspondent repatriated last week after 20 months in Italian and

German prison camps, said today that despite allied bombings German trains "were running on time" and just as regularly as they do from Grand Central station.

Allen said the official slogan of the Nazi party was "freihelt und brod" (freedom and bread).

"Today the Germans have neither," he said. "We still have both—and they're worth making every sacrifice for."

Allen said that with the launching of the invasion "the war has begun."

"But we have a long costly and bloody struggle to face before Germany is beaten," he added.

"Few people realize how little Germany has actually been hurt—in spite of the damage done by allied bombing."
