

Cooperative Use Of Gasoline For Farm Workers Set

A cooperative arrangement which will provide necessary gasoline for Douglas county people doing essential farm work this summer has been announced by the Portland district OPA office and the state farm labor office in the O. S. C. extension service, according to County Agent J. Roland Parker.

This will permit part-time harvest workers who are placed on farm jobs through the county farm labor office to obtain additional gasoline for necessary farm travel.

When workers register at the farm labor office and are referred to the farm jobs, the county farm labor assistant or county agent will fill out a recommendation for additional gasoline if it is necessary. This recommendation will be submitted to the local war price and rationing board, together with application for this special gasoline ration, according to L. V. Hammock, chairman of the local rationing board.

Each car is required to carry at least four passengers, including the driver, or car capacity. A close check will be made on each trip taken on this special gasoline, says Mr. Hammock, ration board chairman. Employers will be asked to sign a farm work mileage rationing time calendar confirming the mileage traveled in the performance of this farm work. This certificate is required to be presented to the ration board in making future gasoline applications.

Authorized travel and mileage actually used for farm work transportation will be closely checked, County Agent Parker added. It is expected that all necessary gasoline to assist in this year's harvest will be available, but all abuses will be promptly reported to the appropriate rationing board.

Applications for farm work mileage may be obtained at the Douglas county farm labor office located in the Federal building with the county agent's office.

Transfer Co. to haul their goods. Kenneth Slawson is completing a two-car garage on his property and will also have a work shop where he expects to do cabinet work.

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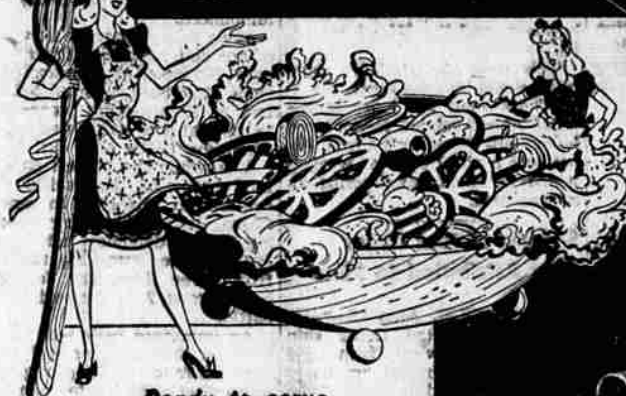
