War Bond Chief Warns Against Overconfidence WASHINGTON, June 22.—(AP)—With bond sales to individuals in the Fifth war loan at 18 per cent of quota, War Finance Director Gamble warned the nation today against overconfidence in the drive. "The tremendous surge of sales that some people expected as an immediate result of the invasion has not happened," he said in a letter to state war finance chairmen calling for "intensified sales effort." Individuals' purchases totaled \$1,081,000,000 through Tuesday, eighth day of the drive. The quota for such sales is \$6,000,000,000 of the over-all goal of \$16,000,000,000.

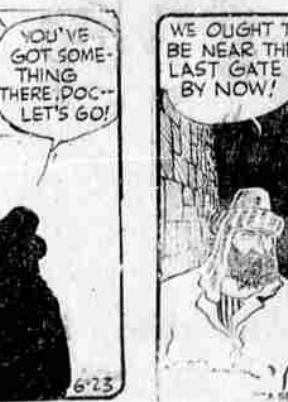
