Alaska Seal Skins Take Planned This Summer
WASHINGTON, June 22.—(AP)—Between 60,000 and 70,000 Alaska seal skins will be taken this summer from the Pribilof islands where the United States government owns the largest seal herd in the world.
Interior Secretary Ickes said today that last year the record number of 117,000 skins were taken to make up for 1942, when no skins were obtained because of military operations near the islands in the Bering sea off Alaska.
The herd now numbers about 2,750,000 animals.
