Aid to Aged From Liquor Fund Hit
PORTLAND, June 26—(AP)—Oregon Methodists want the next state legislature to separate old-age assistance from liquor revenue.

In annual conference here Saturday they denounced the state law that makes the old-age allotments dependent on profits of state-operated liquor stores.

Delegates also condemned "the beverage liquor traffic in all forms" and called for a strong educational program for total abstinence. They asked defeat of a referendum measure which would take exclusive sale of fortified wines away from state liquor stores.

The minimum salary for married ministers was raised from \$1200 to \$1300.

The first Sunday in May was designated Williamette University day. Special offerings will be taken for the Salem Methodist college at that time.

A resolution was adopted urging "establishment of a world council with power to resist any military aggression of one nation against another" and with power to enforce the decisions of a re-established world court.
