Nazi Navy No Longer On Offensive, Gadow Says MADRID, June 29—(AP)—Rear Admiral Richard Gadow, retired German naval officer, declares the German navy is finished as an offensive force and now is "in process of reorganization."

Writing in the Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung, Gadow, who is considered the principal spokesman for the German navy, said "where are our U-boats and heavy warships" was that they were at the bottom of the sea.

The submarine arm, Gadow said, had great success until 1943 "when technical defenses of the enemy ended these achievements." The German navy, he continued, could change from de-
