

Nye Boosts Lead In Primary Count

FORGO, N. D., June 30.—(AP)—The official count of the state canvassing board August 1 may be necessary to determine the republican nominee for United States senator in North Dakota. In one of the closest races in this state in years, the incumbent, Gerald P. Nye, had increased his lead to 521 votes over L. U. Stambaugh, Fargo attorney and former national commander of the American Legion, in nearly complete unofficial returns from Tuesday's primary.

Only 47 scattered precincts of 2,251 were missing today, and Nye had 37,933; Stambaugh 37,072; Congressman Usher L. Burdick 34,769 and A. C. Townley, founder of the nonpartisan league, 1,320.

Oregonians Urged To Join Tax Suit

SALEM, Ore., June 30.—(AP)—Sponsors of Oregon's 1943 community property law urged state officials today to join the state of Oklahoma in the pending United States supreme court appeal involving the validity of the Oklahoma community property law, after which the Oregon law is modeled.

The U. S. circuit court of appeals upheld the Oklahoma law. Under the Oregon law, married couples can elect to have their property declare community property, and thus each husband and wife can file separate federal tax returns and benefit by lower taxes. The law, however, benefits only couples in higher income brackets.

forces stabbed within seven miles of Caen, 31 miles below Florence. The advance west of Lake Trasimeno was general and picturesque. Castiglione Del Lago was among the captured towns.

German efforts to re-equip battered armies in Italy suffered a major blow yesterday when bombers destroyed the bulk of a shipment of about 500 motor vehicles, numerous tanks and supplies of gasoline.

A large shipment was caught on the rail line between Forlì and Rimini. Incomplete reports showed at least 54 rail cars destroyed and 90 damaged. One locomotive was destroyed and three were damaged.

Spitfires destroyed nine locomotives and a number of grounded aircraft at Sarajevo, Yugoslavia.

The Germans said American bombers and fighters attacked the Vienna area this morning, touching off air battles. Weather curtailed flights from Britain.

Allied armies in France and Italy were bleeding the Germans at a fatal rate. Casualties inflicted in Italy in six weeks were estimated between 80,000 and 100,000. In France, around 75,000 Germans have died, surrendered or been wounded since D-day June 6. There were total losses of probably more than 300,000 men in six weeks.

Re-elected vice-chairman was Ezra R. Whitla of Idaho. Harold W. Mason of Vermont was re-elected secretary and Joseph Ross Todd of Kentucky, was named treasurer to succeed Sinclair Weeks of Massachusetts.

Dewey in his address pledged the republican party today to "a gigantic effort in this campaign toward saving of the republic and the winning of the war." He told members they could expect in the months to come to find "all of the busy propaganda agencies of the national government directing their efforts toward the division of our party."

Spangler Praised "You may be sure," Dewey said, "that they are experts in division. They have been creating the impression of a divided American people, a good many years. But they are not going to succeed in dividing us."

He told committee members, most of whom he had conferred with in groups or separately, that he had "never seen such an attitude of unanimity, friendship and confidence in the results in a party in a national election before."

Praising Spangler, Dewey said he was sure "no man ever worked longer hours, and more earnestly" than had the national chairman. The nominee pointed to the Mackinac Island conference of the party as largely Spangler's achievement.

Oregonians Not to Get Whiskey Bonus in July

PORTLAND, June 30.—(AP)—Oregonians will not receive a whiskey bonus in July, the state liquor control commission announced today.

Permit-holders will be limited to the quart of whiskey and the quart of brandy permitted under ration quotas. In May and June the commission allotted an extra fifth of "bonus" whiskey.

Income Tax Reduction To Be Less in Oregon

SALEM, Ore., June 30.—(AP)—The state tax commission will announce about August 1 the 1944 state income tax rate on 1943 incomes. State Tax Commissioner Earl E. Fisher said today.

Under the 1943 legislature's Walker plan, the commission has authority to reduce the tax rate as long as there is more than enough revenue for state needs. The reduction this year was 75 per cent, but Fisher said the reduction next year would be less.

Individuals Lagging in War Bond Purchasing

WASHINGTON, June 30.—(AP)—Corporations and other non-banking investors neared their \$10,000,000,000 goal in the \$16,000,000,000 fifth war loan drive today, but sales to individuals continued to lag.

Sales through Wednesday, as announced last night, totaled \$12,605,000,000, 79 per cent of the quota. Sales to corporations and other non-banking investors totaled \$9,736,000,000, 97 per cent of their quota. Sales to individuals aggregated \$2,869,000,000, 48 per cent of the quota.

Ted R. Gamble, War Finance director, again urged greater emphasis on sales to individuals. The drive, which opened June 12, will close July 8.

Nickel Cup of Coffee Will Come Back July 31

PORTLAND, June 30.—(AP)—The nickel cup of coffee—comparatively rare in Portland restaurants these days—will come back again on July 31, the district OPA said today.

OPA officials said a new price order will roll back coffee to the cost listed on restaurant menus October 4-10, 1942. At the same time, most of today's 10-cent cups were selling for a nickel.

If you fail to appear and answer said complaint, plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in his complaint on file in the above court and cause, a succinct statement thereof is as follows: For a decree quieting the title to the following described real property, to-wit:

Lot five (5) of Block five (5) of Hamilton's Addition to the City of Roseburg, Douglas county, Oregon, according to the official plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the county clerk of Douglas county, Oregon; together with the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto;

That you, and each of you, be required to appear and set forth the nature of your claim, if any, to said real property, that all adverse claims thereto be determined by decree of the above court; that it be decreed that the defendants, and each of them, have not any right, title, claim or interest in or to the above described real property, or any part or parcel thereof
