## Wilno, Rail Center, Now Goal of Reds

Martial Law Declared By Germans; Slaughter Near Minsk Increased

LONDON, July 7.—(AP)—German reports said the Russians were advancing today within ten miles of Wilno, where Moscow reported the nazis had declared martial law.

Smashing beyond the Old Polish bastion of Kowel, the Russians were approaching the Bug river at a point about 135 miles southeast of Warsaw along the main trunk line. Virtually all the pre-war Polish frontier was crossed save for a section in the Pripyat marshes.

Wilno, city of 207,750 which has changed nationality six times since the last war, lies but 97 miles from the border of East Prussia and is a rail and highway center. A Moscow dispatch quoted Yustas Paletskis, chairman of the presidium of the supreme soviet of Lithuania, as saying the German martial law edict barred persons from the streets between 8 p. m. and 5 a. m. and forbade walking in groups greater than two. Paletskis said there had been uprisings in Kaunas, Mariampole and Vilnius.

Slaughter increased

While at least four Russian army groups pushed westward, other soviet forces mopped up bewildered German stragglers east of Minsk, leagues behind the main front, Moscow said 5,000 were killed last night. The mid-night communique listed at least 9,000 Germans killed in all and nearly 1,000 captured.

Lithuania and Latvian borders both were within easy striking distance of red armies. Forces of the Leningrad district drove deeper into the Finnish front. At one place, the soviets were within 18 miles of the Warsaw-Leningrad railroad.

On the main Minsk-Warsaw railroad 81 miles beyond the captured capital of White Russia, red troops laid siege to the important rail center of Baranowice from nearest reported positions 11 miles away.

At the close of the meeting, Mr. Beard was presented with the past president's pin by Bill Turner, student Rotarian, on behalf of the Hi-Y club of the high school.

Mr. Hampton announced committee appointments and also called a meeting of all officers, directors and committee chairmen to be held July 19, at which plans will be made for the year's activities.

Mel Ingram, newly appointed athletic coach of Roseburg high school, and supervisor of the summer recreation program, told the Rotarians of the plans for recreation for adults and children during the summer months and an enlarged athletic program at the high school during the coming year.

children; construction of a combination wading pool, tennis court and skating rink to be started soon; softball for girls, and a baseball school for boys.

All students of senior high school, junior high school or fifth and sixth grade age, who are interested in summer instruction in music are asked to contact Paul S. Elliott, acting city school superintendent, or Leslie S. Irvin, band director, Ingram stated today. Irvin, graduate of the University of Oregon, where he played in the band and directed an orchestra, has been employed by the school board to reorganize the school band. He has been teaching band at Clatskanie, where he had very fine success.

Early Registration Asked

Boys or girls desiring band instruction are requested to contact Mr. Elliott or Mr. Irvin at the junior high school building, phone 434. Immediate registration is desired in order that practice may start without delay.

The invitation is extended to all boys and girls who own or play any wind instrument. Ability to perform, or the number of

lessons already had by the individual, does not matter, it was stated. Those who respond to the notice and engage in summer practice will have a decided advantage over music students beginning at the fall term.

Mr. Irvin hopes to be able, he reports, to build the school band up to a point comparable with the famous Roseburg bands of past years. Plans also are being made to organize a beginner band during the summer and further announcement will be made when such plans are complete.

The project is being made a definite part of the summer recreational program under the supervision of Mr. Ingram and the city park commission.

For Small Children

Another forward step in the program, Ingram reports, is that of a playground for small children starting Monday, July 10.

Miss Ann Elliott, student at Willamette university, has been secured as supervisor and will conduct supervised play for children from 6 to 12 years daily, except Sunday, at the playground opposite the junior high school. Smaller children also will be accepted for games, story reading, etc., but should be accompanied by parents, if possible.

Miss Elliott also is interested in contacting older girls interested in formation of softball and volleyball leagues.

Plans for installation of permanent playground equipment at the school site have been completed, Ingram states.

Of principal importance will be the construction of a wading pool 96 by 46 feet. It will be equipped with two spray showers, to provide a place where small youngsters may frolic in safety during warm weather.

The pool, however, is so designed that, when drained, it may be used for a tennis court or as an outdoor roller skating rink.

The playground also is to be equipped with swings, teeters,

slides and other apparatus.

Grading of grounds and construction of permanent equipment is expected to get under way next week, Ingram said.

Baseball On Program

Also to start next Monday is Ingram's baseball school for boys from the ages of 12 to 17 years. Classes will be held at Finlay field each Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 3 p. m. and Tuesdays and Thursdays at 6:30 p. m. All interested boys are invited.

Ingram, who is to serve as athletic coach of Roseburg high school, is a former professional baseball player and is greatly interested in the game of baseball, and hopes to be able to develop much local talent. The school will be for the purpose of teaching fundamentals of the game, but will include matched games and possibly a short league series. Ingram is to be assisted by Randall Young.
