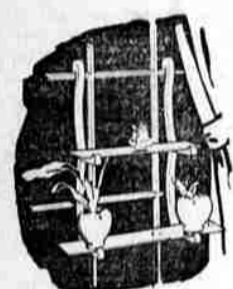

## Meeting of Churchill and FDR Due Soon

WASHINGTON, July 13—(AP)—A meeting between President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill may come about before long, the way cleared in part by Mr. Roosevelt's dramatic revision of French policy to permit practical cooperation with General Charles De Gaulle.

The problem of Anglo-American relations with De Gaulle's national committee of liberation has been one of the most difficult ever to trouble the course of affairs which have to be handled jointly by Washington and London. The president and the prime minister have at various times been fairly close together in their desire not to recognize the committee as a provisional government, but Mr. Churchill's position has been complicated first by the fact that his own foreign office has long favored recognition and second by indications that this attitude in recent months has become increasingly widespread throughout the British government.

Had this recognition issue remained in a highly unsettled condition with allied armies in France, it would undoubtedly have colored all the discussions of Mr. Roosevelt and Mr. Churchill in their expected talks.

No time for these talks has been indicated. The president, however, has hinted at two news conferences that he expects to see the prime minister this summer or fall and that he would probably make the trip to Britain this time instead of having Mr. Churchill come over.

## Hungry Rome Is Still Beset By Near Chaos

Rome, July 13—(AP)—Premier Ivanoe Bonomi's government will establish itself Saturday in a Rome still beset by chaotic conditions after six weeks of allied occupation.

Though the capital's food supply problems are far from solved, the food situation is better for the masses than in the final days under the Germans, but most public services are worse now than when the Germans were here. The main cause of this is the damage done to installations by the Germans.

Shortage of electric power is one of Rome's greatest tribulations. Power came almost entirely from hydro-electric establishments to the north, and many of these installations were wrecked by the Germans.

The bread ration now is two-thirds of a pound daily, three times what it was under the Germans, and the quality of bread is the best Rome has had in years. The bread is available on ration cards at a very low fixed price.

Prices of goods sold to allied soldiers have trebled in many cases since the fifth army came into the city.

Rome today is a city of contrasts—an extremely dreary place in some regards; in other respects gay than in many years. Dancing, which the fascists banned for the duration of the war, has started again in some hotels and clubs. It is more of a playground for off-duty officers and soldiers than any place in the Mediterranean theatre since Cairo.

PORTLAND, July 13—(AP)—Portland school system employees will receive salary increases plus a \$20 monthly cost of living bonus.

The bonuses, approved at a meeting last night, are a continuation of a program started last year. Federal funds are advanced to aid in the program, offsetting war-caused increases in the district's expenditures.

### Contracts Awarded By Highway Board

PORTLAND, July 13—(AP)—The state highway commission has awarded J. A. Terteling and son, of Boise, Idaho, a contract to construct 3.86 miles of the Nehalem secondary highway on a low bid of \$297,728. The strip will be graded and paved in the Astoria naval hospital section.

At its regular meeting here yesterday, the commission gave A. H. Harbour and son, Portland, a \$38,500 contract to paint the Coos Bay bridge.

E. C. Tall Co., Eugene, submitted low bid of \$178,019 for 3.3 miles of grade widening and 11.35 miles of surfacing and oiling on the Foster-Canyon Creek section of the Santiam highway in Linn county. The Linn county bid was referred to the state engineer for consideration and award.

Another Linn county project—a timber-truss bridge across the Santiam river west of Cascadia—was turned over to the Linn county court for award and payment. Lindstrom brothers, Port-

land, submitted the low bid of \$14,676.

A collection of obsolete machinery accessories was sold by the commission for \$3459.
