LONDON, July 13—(AP)—The Germans fired a fresh batch of winged bombs against England today and a dispatch from France disclosed that the Germans had used flying bombs against the Americans in Normandy. It was expected that the Germans would make increasing use of them but because of their inaccuracy they were unlikely to have a marked effect on military operations.
