

Shasta Dam Is Now Furnishing Commercial Power

SACRAMENTO, July 14—(AP)—Reclamation bureau officials said today arrangements are complete for the official start of commercial disposal of Shasta dam power over portions of the government-owned Shasta - Oro-

ville power line tomorrow. A ceremony marking the event has been cancelled due to the inability of Secretary of the Interior to attend. Tomorrow's affair will consist of little more than the throwing of a switch by a member of the operating crew. Actually, power transmission has been underway for some time. As directed by congress, the bureau said the output of the central valley project power plant has been delivered to the Pacific Gas and Electric company since the start of the testing period. The one unit in operation is capable of a maximum output in excess of 78,000 kilowatts. Several months of a new rainy season will be required to impound the full storage capacity of the huge dam.

When the reservoir is full and all the power units are in operation, Shasta will generate 375,000 kilowatts, or nearly 20 percent of the present capacity of all the state's hydro-electric plants.
