British Parliament

Member, Relative of Roseburg Resident, Dies

Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Brand of Roseburg have received indirect word of the death of Hon. Ian C. Hannah, prominent member of the British parliament. Mr. Hannah, a brother-in-law of Mr. Brand, has visited in Roseburg, and has a number of acquaintances in the city.

The word of his death was printed in the New York Times, which carried a dispatch from London reporting his death. No direct communication has been received.

Mr. Hannah was married to Miss Edith Brand, sister of C. A. Brand, whom he met when she was an art student in Paris. Before election to parliament, Mr.

Hannah was lecturer at Cambridge university. The Hannahs have three sons in British military service.
