The best played softball game of the season resulted last night in a 2 to 0 victory by the Roseburg Lumber company team over Olympia Supply. Neither team committed an error and no batter received a walk. In the second game, Dunham's Dubs defeated the Sutherlin Caribous 7 to 6, with a seventh-inning rally.

The opening game furnished fans with the most airtight contest seen so far this year. The Roseburg Lumber company scored twice, once in the first inning and again in the seventh, the pattern being the same both times, when a scratch single, stolen base, and a long single produced the winning runs. Peterson, pitching for Olympia Supply, allowed only six scattered hits, but was bested by Blake, who allowed only three hits during the entire contest.

The Caribous held Dunham's scoreless until the fourth inning, after taking a two-run lead in the fourth inning. Dunham's tied the score at 2-all in the fifth, but Sutherlin went back into the lead by one run in the last half of the frame. In the first of the seventh, five hits and an error gave Dunham's five runs. Sutherlin put on a determined rally and bunched two hits, which, with two walks, accounted for three runs, but was short of tying the score.
