Cox' Bat Wins 2 For Solons; Turpin Blanks Portland

(By the Associated Press)

Third Baseman Cox of the Sacramento Solons rapped out six hits off San Diego pitchers yesterday and two of them accounted for runs which gave the Solons both ends of a coast league double-header.

A tenth-inning double by Cox sent Angel home to win the opener 6 to 5, and he tripled Handley home in the sixth inning of the next game for a 1 to 0 victory.

The double win gave the Sacs five games out of seven in the week's series with San Diego and moved them up to sixth position, ahead of the Seattle Rainiers, for the first time this year.

The Hollywood Stars took possession of third place with another double win over the Oakland Acons. The two games contrasted sharply as the Stars had to come from behind three times in the free-hitting opener to come up with a 10-7 win, then settled the nightcap by scoring five times in the first inning for a 5 to 2 victory.

Turpin Blanks Beavers—Seattle and Portland split a couple of shutout games, Seattle taking the opener, 2 to 0, but the second game, 0 to 1, in 10 innings. Hal Turpin did a two-hit trick for the Rainiers and Portland's Helsner twirled a three-hitter. The loss dropped Seattle to seventh for the first time since 1937.

San Francisco finished the week one game behind the league leading Los Angeles Angels after splitting a doubleheader with the Angels. Los Angeles won the opener, 9 to 4, and the Sacs the nightcap, 2 to 0.
