Grange Masters Oppose Japs' Return to West

Portland, Ore., Aug. 22—(AP)—Grange masters representing 125,000 members in five western states asked the federal government yesterday to prohibit persons of Japanese extraction from returning to the west coast after the war.

The masters, representing granges in Oregon, California, Washington, Idaho and Montana, made their request in a resolution.

The same resolution condemned the War Relocation authority for "conducting a propaganda campaign to arouse public sympathy for persons of Japanese extraction," adding that such persons "have failed to assimilate themselves and can never be assimilated into American community life."

The grangers said they were asking their congressional delegations to halt the WRA's program of resettlement of Japanese in the west.

Results were announced here after a ballot count yesterday. Husband will occupy the fourth district chair of Otto J. Frohnmeyer, Medford, whose retirement will be effective at the Gearhart convention of the bar Sept. 28-30. Ebinger will replace John F. Kilkenny, Pendleton, second district.

Bryan Goodenough, Salem, was named to the first district seat held by Bruce Spaulding, Salem, and Hugh L. Barzee, Portland, to the third district. Arthur H. Lewis, Portland, was elected delegate to the house of delegates of the American Bar association.
