Hugh Acreage Acquired By U. S. During War. WASHINGTON, Aug. 26.—(AP)—The federal government has acquired during the war more than 34,000,000 acres of land, exclusive of areas taken over by the Defense Plant Corporation, Senator O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) said yesterday.

The total value, he said, is undetermined but the government has paid out \$563,325,816 for the properties.

O'Mahoney has introduced a bill under which surplus land, available to veterans for homesteads or business purposes, the remainder to be administered by the interior department.

Beware Pacifists, Legion Chief Says

BOISE, Idaho, Aug. 26.—(AP)—Warren H. Atherton of Sacramento, Calif., national commander of the American Legion, called Tuesday night for all-out production of war goods "right up until midnight of V-day."

Speaking at the Idaho annual convention, Atherton also urged adoption of a compulsory military training act after the war.

"I fully expect as soon as this war is over that thousands of day dreaming pacifists will besiege Washington to have the United States disarm," he asserted, adding:

"The country must be alert against such propaganda. We put out one world conflagration 25 years ago with apparatus made after it started. Then we threw away the equipment."

"We have suffered a second conflagration that has all but destroyed civilization and we should keep a few fire engines on hand."

Atherton predicted the Pacific war will end within a year after Germany's collapse, but said it now is slowed by a shipping shortage.
