More Pickles for Army
Quantity of cucumber pickles, cucumber pickle products and accessories which a packer must first contract to sell to the army before making other sales has been raised by WFA from 25 per cent to 40 per cent.

Beef Set-Aside Upped
Federally-inspected slaughterers are now required to set aside for government procurement half of the quantities of beef meeting army specifications following WFA's advancement of the set-aside percentage from 45 to 50 in order to make available to the U. S. military forces the necessary quantities of beef.

To Meet Gas Quotas
The Petroleum Administration for War says that third-quarter gasoline quotas to agricultural users will be met, although local and temporary shortages may develop as a result of the shortage of tires for truck tankers. The agency states that the petroleum situation will improve almost immediately with reductions in military demands.

Farm Labor Far Down
The number of people working on farms on August 1 was the lowest for that date in 20 years of monthly records—the total of 10,608,000 persons working on farms was 4 per cent less than on August 1, 1943, and 6 per cent below the 1935-39 August average.

Point Reports Required
While farmers may slaughter any number of livestock owned by them without restriction or without making any slaughter report, OPA regulations require that reports be made in connection with the collection of ration points for meat. Farmers who make sales or transfers of meat having a point value other than zero should consult their local War Rationing Board regarding the report which OPA requires them to make.

Fewer Egg Replacements
Hatchings in July were the lightest since 1939 with the output of chicks by commercial hatcheries during July only 39 per cent of the output in July last year—32,307,000 against 83,084,000 down 61 per cent. Hatchings for the first seven months of 1944 totalled 1,100,820,000 chicks compared with 1,410,944,000 for this period of 1943, a decrease of 22 per cent. Chicks produced during the remaining months of this year will be primarily for the production of commercial broilers.
