Cardinals Win 6th Game, 3-1, Become World Champs

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 10 (AP)—The best team in baseball won the world series and that's as it should be.

Superb strikeout pitching and perfect infield play by the St. Louis Cardinals with an occasional flash of power cooled off the Browns' hot streak and left them a beaten ball club, losers 4 to 2 in games after a tough uphill struggle in a six-tilt battle.

Overshadowed by the total of 92 third-strike victims that swept all series records off the books was the routine destruction of American league rallies engineered by Marty Marion and the other Cardinal infielders, who supplemented "Duke" Shortstop, The Red Bird quartet handled 124 chances without a boot while the Browns' inner circle bobbled seven of 126 tries.

It was pitching again in yesterday's finale when Billy Southworth's crew regained the world championship they lost to the Yankees a year ago. Outstanding victory was the pitching of Freshman Ted Wilks, who fied miserably on his only start in the third game.

The Polish had stopped the Browns without a hit in 3 2-3 innings after Starter Max Lanier went haywire on a wild streak in the sixth.

Three singles mixed in with a costly error by Stephens and a walk in the fourth inning scored three runs, overcame the Brown's 1-0 lead and meant the ball game.

Although the victors outbit the Browns, 240 to 183, George McQuinn, Luke Sewell's only consistent performer at the plate led both teams with a .338 average, driven in five of his club's 12 scores.

Excess Mailing of Political Speech Stirs House Row

WASHINGTON, Oct. 9 (AP)—Chairman Anderson (D., N. M.) of the house campaign expenditures investigating committee indicated Saturday that congress might be asked to put what he termed "reasonable limits" on its free mailing privileges.

This was the latest in a series of fast-breaking developments following a report filed by Anderson with his committee that 13 republicans had mailed 3,116,000 copies of one political speech at government expense.

After President Roosevelt quoted the Anderson report in his Thursday radio address, Rep. Taber (R., N. Y.) retorted that the number of speeches sent out under frank by the democrats exceeded the number sent out by the republicans three to one.
