SOME of Douglas county's 70 billion feet of merchantable "green gold." Pictured herewith is Douglas fir growing on Emile creek, a tributary of Little River.

Thousands of acres in this area are covered with timber stands similar to this. The trees, on average, are not large—three feet in diameter, perhaps—but their size is quite uniform and their trunks are branchless for the first 100 or 125 feet. One quarter section I saw, one of the relatively few privately owned pieces in the U. S. forest, cruised 9 million feet.

Forest service engineers were active in the Emile watershed during the past summer, surveying routes for logging roads which would serve possible future timber operations there.
