Frank Shields, 49, former resident of Roseburg, died Saturday at the Fort Milby veterans hospital in San Francisco following a four months' illness.

Born at Olalla, Ore., Feb. 23, 1895, the son of B. F. and Fannie Shields, he served in the first World war, and upon his return from military service was married in 1919 at Roseburg to Della Ellis. He had made his home for the past 18 years at Isleton, Calif., where he owned and operated a garage and service station. Surviving are his wife; a son, Harold, now in military service, also a son at home and a daughter, Mrs. Lawrence Dewey, Isleton; his father, B. F. Shields, Roseburg; four sisters, Mrs. E. C. The body is being brought to Roseburg and services will be held at 2 p. m. Thursday at the Roseburg Undertaking company chapel, conducted by the Rev. H. P. Scoone. Interment will follow in Fair Oaks cemetery.
