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CORDON, MORSE, ELLSWORTH

WE have been discussing at much length recently the various initiative and referendum measures coming before voters at the election Nov. 7. Today we want to discuss men—not measures—particularly three men. They are Guy Cordon, Wayne Morse and Harris Ellsworth.
Cordon and Ellsworth are candidates for United States Senator and Ellsworth is seeking re-election to the office of Congressman from the Fourth Oregon district.
There is little reason to bring arguments before Douglas county voters as to why they should vote for Cordon and Ellsworth. They are well known, and their exceptional work in congress so self-evident, that here in Douglas county, where both make their homes, they should receive unanimous endorsement.
Nor is there any reason why their candidacy should be placed upon a basis of partisanship. If their respective opponents were representative of the Democratic party there might be reason to expect Democratic voters to give some measure of consideration to their own party nominees. But in this instance neither of the men running on the Democratic ticket has any standing with the party which he espouses. Both are self-starters.
Willis Mahoney, who opposes Guy Cordon for the senatorial position, is strictly a New Deal coat-tail hanger-on, an opportunist of the first water. He comes to Oregon, where he claims residence, only when he sees an opportunity to seize a political plum. He has toadied to radical groups, promising anything, and has so encumbered himself with conflicting pledges that any semblance of sincerity has been destroyed.
The candidate opposing Ellsworth, Floyd Dover, has offered no basic reason for his candidacy, except that he served as a brave soldier in the last world war. His entire political effort in the two campaigns in which he has entered has been that of a professional veteran, seeking to profit by his excellent record as a soldier.
The candidacy of Wayne Morse has been bedeviled by so many smoke screens that some voters are apt to become confused. Morse has been branded by his political enemies as a New Dealer, a communist, an opportunist and other derogatory labels until some voters who are not acquainted with the man are naturally confused.
The best answer to all this opposition camouflage is to consider the vote given him in Lane county, where he makes his home.
Here in Douglas county, at the primary election, we gave Guy Cordon an overwhelming majority, a majority that won him the nomination. We gave him that majority because we know him and his ability. Lane county voters, who know Wayne Morse as we know Guy Cordon, gave Morse the same type of endorsement we gave Cordon. Lane county voters are not radicals. Their votes are along the same conservative lines as in Douglas county. Therefore we can trust the integrity of the vote in Lane county. Morse must not be the type of man his enemies try to picture him if he can get that kind of a vote from the people who know him best.
Opposing Morse is Edgar Smith. The Democratic nominee is a fine fellow. He has a pleasing personality and average qualifications.
If Smith should be elected he would be the only Democrat in an otherwise solid Republican delegation in Congress from Oregon, for we cannot visualize the defeat of Cordon or Ellsworth. In such capacity he would be of little value, insofar as any congressional matters pertaining to the state were concerned.
No matter whether the New Deal or Republican party wins the presidential election, Oregon can best be served by having a solid Republican delegation in Washington. To breach the solidarity by sending one Democrat would completely destroy effectiveness.
We urge Douglas county voters to unite behind Cordon, Morse and Ellsworth at the coming election.

and elsewhere.
THERE was quite a ruckus.
At one point Chiang seems to have agreed to give Stilwell command of Chinese field forces. Then, suddenly, he balked, ascertaining that Stilwell MUST GO and citing charges against him. (The charges are withheld by censorship.)
At the last minute, Nelson and Hurley WEAKENED, agreeing to WITHDRAW STILWELL "as a face-saving gesture" demanded by Chiang. (Chiang was specifically informed that the U. S. does not accept his charges against Stilwell.)
Glover concludes: "In China, Chiang evidently gained great 'face' by the maneuver, which is looked upon in many Chinese and AMERICAN quarters as 'capitulation' (on our part)."
THERE the matters rests. It would be stretching the truth badly to say that it is a satisfactory solution. But at least the American people now know that all isn't sweetness and light in China.
Up to now, Chiang has been pictured as one of the world's great democrats and the Chinese as a people unanimously aflame with devotion to the ideals of democracy and ready to die uncompromisingly to the last man in his holy cause.
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CHURCHILL drops out of his personal role of realistic reporter and tells the British house of commons that the war against Germany may last into next summer and the war against Japan until the end of 1946.
If we are to appreciate his words correctly, we must UNDERSTAND HIS REASONS for speaking them.
Britain has adopted "don't change horses in the middle of the stream" as an OFFICIAL policy, and there has been no British election since the war began.
Churchill wants that policy CONTINUED.
(Hence his pessimistic forecast of the possible length of the war, which contrasts rather notably with his previous much more optimistic forecasts. Politicians, even Churchill, have to trim their sails according to the political winds.)
ON our own political home front, the New Dealers spring a new version of their "don't change horses in the middle of the stream" wacry. They (Byrnes and Truman) now say: "Don't take out the winning team on the EVE of victory."
(Churchill, speaking with similar political purposes, intimates, definitely that instead of this being the "eve of victory" the war
