WHILE uniformed men and women throughout the world are fighting with implements of war to preserve democracy...

Spearheading this attack are veterans of the last World War, allied with other strong groups. Their attack has been continuous and relentless...

It is being mentioned briefly now because this is National Education Week, November 5 to 11, the one time of the year when this fight for democracy through education calls public attention to its battle.

When in 1917-18, this nation was called into world conflict, it was found that 41 per cent of the soldiers in the army had not completed the seventh grade in school...

The fight has since attracted new allies. Today the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, the National Association of Manufacturers, the American Federation of Labor...

Half of the voters had less than an eighth grade education, yet it is after the eighth grade that study of history, economics and civics is begun.

Consider also these important facts: 1. There are more inmates of prisons, mental institutions, and almshouses than there are students in colleges and universities...

You may be surprised at these statistics, quoted from information supplied by the National Commission for the Defense of Democracy Through Education...

But there is a brighter side to the picture. That brighter side is shown as we study the progress being made. Instead of only 40 per cent of the soldiers in the army having less than a seventh grade education...

It is well that National Education week is observed in these critical days that we may be reminded again how important education is to preservation of democracy...
