## Student Vote at RHS Forecasts Roosevelt's Win

Popular vote in junior American history classes at RHS forecast the national election by electing President Roosevelt a 72-23 lead in sample ballot elections held Monday and Tuesday at senior high school. An electoral vote setup by Miss Grace Covert, instructor, resulted in a tie for the two candidates.

The election climaxed two weeks of study on the legislative and election methods of government organization. The four classes were divided into precincts according to the class periods and each class was given six electoral votes.

Last week "campaign" speeches were given by volunteer students for each party and Friday Tom Parkinson, state senator, explained referendum and initiative measures on the ballot. Each student made an election notebook containing headlines, political jokes and pictures.

Among the state measures which carried on the student ballot were the Burke bill and the school support bill.
