Douglas For Cordon, Morse, Ellsworth
Republican candidates for congress won hearty endorsement from Douglas county voters in Tuesday's election. Senator Guy Cordon led his democratic opponent Willis Mahoney, more than 3 to 1, while Wayne Morse outdistanced E. W. Smith by only a slightly smaller proportion. Congressman Harris Ellsworth held an approximate 3 to 1 lead over Floyd Dover, the democratic nominee. Votes by precincts, as unofficially tabulated by the News-Review were as follows:

Glendale precinct was the first to report its vote, calling in a 8:17 p. m. Cow Creek, Dixonville, Wilbur, Days Creek and Camas

Valley followed in rapid order. Some of the larger precincts did not complete the tally of their votes until around 4 a. m. By 4:30 a. m. News-Review tabulators had compiled results of 48 of the county's 49 precincts, Scottsburg remaining unreported.

The News-Review management is particularly grateful for assistance given by County Clerk Roy Agee, Sheriff Bud Carter, Deputy Sheriff Harry McCabe, Reedsport, and the many election board members who assisted by telephoning their reports.

Management and staff members of the News-Review and Station KRNR also join in expression of appreciation to Attorney and Mrs. Dexter Rice who, following a custom of several years' standing, provided the tabulating and reporting crews with a delicious midnight lunch. Appreciated also was the work of telephone operators at Roseburg and throughout the various exchanges of the county who, in addition to handling the large number of calls, gave much personal assistance in gathering reports.

Atty. Gen. Neuner Given 2-to-1 Margin

Attorney General George Neuner, former Douglas county district attorney, is still a "favorite son," as shown by the manner in which he was supported by county voters in Tuesday's election, receiving more than a 2 to 1 vote over Bruce Spaulding, the democratic candidate. At the same time State Treasurer Scott was given a very substantial margin over Lambert, democratic aspirant. Votes unofficially tabulated by the News-Review were as follows:
