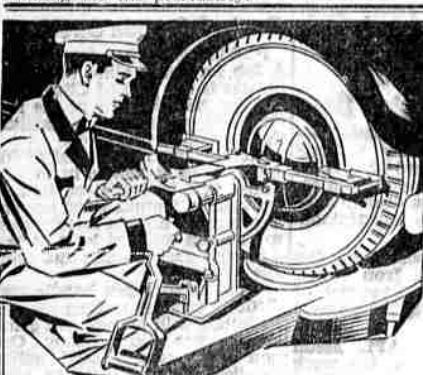
ROSEBURG WOMAN'S CLUB TO SEW ON WEDNESDAY
