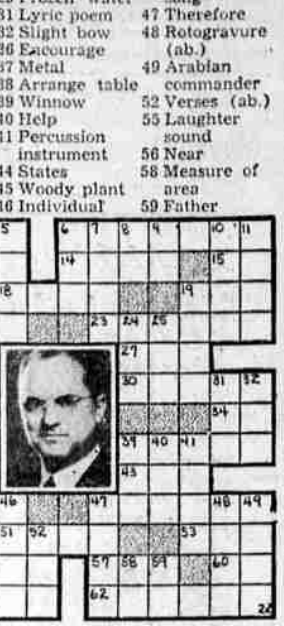

**REEDSPORT** — Mrs. Peter Cowan, 69, one of the lower Umpqua community's best known women, died Saturday night at her Smith River home.

Born April 3, 1875, at Ottawa, Canada, the daughter of Hugh and Sarah Cassidy, she came with her parents to Smith River in 1881. She was married November 7, 1891, to Peter Cowan, who was an early-day member of the Umpqua coast guard station, and who, since retirement from that service in 1910, has been engaged in farming and dairying.

Mr. and Mrs. Cowan celebrated their 53rd wedding anniversary at their farm home last November 7.

Surviving are the husband; a daughter, Margaret Cowan Smith; a son, Oliver Cowan, Smith River, and a son, Jack, now with the U. S. navy in the South Pacific. She also leaves a brother, Dan Cassidy, San Francisco; two sisters, Mrs. John Riley, San Francisco, and Mrs. Joe Feldman, Portland, and six grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at St. Ann's Catholic church in Reedspport at 11 a. m. Wednesday with interment following in the Reedspport Masonic cemetery.
