Social Security Payments Upped In Douglas County

Old age and survivors insurance payments have become an important item in the payroll of Douglas county. Figures released today by C. H. Cannon, manager of the Eugene office of the Social Security board, show a total annual payoff of \$40,250 in Douglas county. This is an increase since August 1, 1944, of \$2,618 a year. In Douglas county 94 retired workers are receiving \$2,764 a year, and the wives of these same workers who are 63 are all getting \$3,372 a year. Children of workers who were insured under old age and survivors insurance number 63 in Douglas county. Monthly payments to them total \$8,412 a year. The widows who have children under 18 in their care in this county receive \$3,086 a year. Monthly payments are also being made to aged widows and dependent parents of deceased workers of \$1,716 a year.
