Health Clinic Set At Glide School

There will be a clinic for immunization against smallpox and diphtheria at the Glide school Tuesday, Nov. 28, at 10 a. m. for all school children and pre-school children in the Glide area. Dr. E. J. Wainwright, county health officer, and Mrs. Ethel Littler, county nurse, will conduct the clinic. For those children who have previously been immunized against diphtheria a Schick test will be given to ascertain whether or not they still maintain their immunity.

The tuberculin skin test will also be offered. This test is made by placing a drop of liquid called tuberculin within the upper surface layer of the skin. This is harmless. If the spot becomes red and slightly swollen within two or three days it means that tuberculosis germs are somewhere in the body. The small red reaction area disappears and leaves no scar or other effects. If the test is positive the chest should be X-rayed to be certain that no harm is being done in the lungs. This program is financed by the annual sale of Christmas seals.

Any adults who wish to have this skin test are welcome at this clinic.
