many. When Jap production has been seriously crippled, we'll close in for the kill—as we're doing in Europe now.

THE Jap radio is following the line long since made familiar by Germany—little damage to military installations, MUCH damage to hospitals and residences.

ON Leyte, MacArthur's men take Limon and slog on southward in the mud. Their Leyte job from here on is the bitter one of prying Japs out of holes.

IN western Europe, the French are fighting in Strasbourg and apparently have the remnants of the German 19th army surrounded on the west bank of the Rhine.

There are three bridges in Strasbourg—two highway, one rail. The Germans say we're fighting for ONE of these bridges—indicating they haven't yet been destroyed.

These are the ONLY permanent bridges from Strasbourg to the Swiss border. Elsewhere the nazis are using pontoon bridges, which they FOLD UP and TAKE IN during the day, using them ONLY at NIGHT, when our planes can't see to destroy them.

There are fairly dependable reports as this is written that our advanced patrols have CROSSED THE RHINE into Germany in this area. These are presumably reconnaissance units.

Still, the fact that they can GET OVER indicates that the Rhine at this point isn't too strongly held by the nazis.

THE big battle is still between T Aachen and Cologne. Here the Germans have committed the bulk of their BEST troops. It seems to be a do-or-die battle on their part.

PROTECTION IS NOT CHARITY

A HEALTH education movement was launched in this country forty years ago that has helped save four million lives. It was aimed at tuberculosis, which at that time killed more persons annually than any other disease.

Today, 2,500 state and local groups are affiliated in the campaign against tuberculosis. These groups, of which the Douglas County Tuberculosis association is one, do not build sanatoriums or rest homes for tuberculosis patients.

When we consider that tuberculosis today is SEVENTH on the list of disease killers, instead of FIRST as in 1904, we realize the effectiveness of the educational program of the tuberculosis associations.

Everyone can participate in the campaign against the White Plague by using Christmas Seals, the sale of which supports the work of the tuberculosis association.

THE BRIDGES. WATCH this Aachen-Cologne battle. It may develop into one of the decisive struggles of history.

THE Russians spring a new offensive in Slovakia—just north of where they are fighting to outflank Budapest. It looks like they're using gas we are on the western front!

There is an interesting development on the international political front. Churchill, in a surprise Thanksgiving address, says: "In three or four years the United States has become the greatest military, naval and air power IN THE WORLD."

That, he says, is cause for American thanksgiving. He adds that it is cause for BRITISH thanksgiving also—"BECAUSE under the compulsion of mysterious and all-powerful destiny WE ARE TOGETHER... shedding our blood side by side, struggling for the same ideals and joined together until the triumph of the great causes which we serve has been made manifest."

IT is a nice concession from Britain, for some four centuries mistress of the world, but we can't help wondering WHY it is made.
