A Chungking source close to Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek declared malicious and mendacious today a Calcutta dispatch to the London Daily Mail which said that China's leader and his wife had separated "after an open disagreement at a Chungking tea party."

Mrs. Chiang is in the United States convalescing from a long illness, its nature unannounced. Actually the tea party to which the Calcutta dispatch apparently referred was not a breaking up party, but was a meeting deliberately arranged by the generalissimo and his wife to stop gossip about them which they feared endangered both China and Chiang's political security.
