

## Roseburg Soldier May Have Been 1st To Land on France

Captain Robert L. Harris, son of Mayor and Mrs. W. F. Harris, Roseburg, wrote home several weeks ago in the belief that he was the first Roseburg man to set foot on the soil of France and the first into Paris, and said he would like to learn whether any one from Roseburg or vicinity had "beat his time." He stepped ashore in France at 5:30 p. m. June 7 and was in Paris at 9 p. m. August 25, while serving with headquarters of the 12th army group.

A copy of the News-Review containing Captain Harris' claim reached the 597th parachute regiment and the boys of that outfit want to know what detained the Roseburg captain.

"It is now common knowledge," writes Sgt. Floyd Andrus, Roseburg, "that the first units to hit France were parachute troops, who landed on June 6th. The following named men with our unit landed in France on June 6th at 2:41 a. m.: Sgt. Wilbur Thompson, Sgt. Horace Pendergrass, Cpl. Charles Cleveland, Cpl. Don Wright and myself. There are quite a number of others from the Roseburg vicinity that I know about.

"I am quite sure that Cpl. Don Wright beat Captain Harris into Paris."

"With us it really doesn't matter who gets the credit, just so long as the public has the facts."

"We were the happiest men on earth to meet up with those beachhead forces after days of fighting in true guerrilla warfare, which was the worst kind of hell a bunch of men ever had to go through. It is the teamwork of all these different groups that is beating the pants off the Jerries."

Corporal Donald Wright, son of Mr. and Mrs. Perry Wright, was taken prisoner during the action to which Sgt. Andrus refers. Sgt. Pendergrass, son of Mrs. Margaret Pendergrass, was reported missing in action, but later returned to his unit after having escaped capture, remaining in hiding until the invasion caught up with him.

## Give War Loan Priority Over Yule, Plea to Americans

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5—(AP)—Christmas shoppers crowded to the center of the stage today in the sixth war loan drive.

The treasury issued an appeal to the fighting throngs in the nation's stores to remember the fighting men shooting it out with the nation's enemies.

Treasury officials said it was well realized when the Nov. 20-Dec. 16 dates of the drive were chosen that it would coincide with heavy gift-buying, but—

"War expenditures don't accommodate themselves to our traditional Christmas season."

Ted R. Gamble, national director of war finance, said:

"Santa can serve the boys overseas very well, by including a lot of war bonds in his bag of gifts."

"It's necessary this year to give the sixth war loan priority over Christmas shopping. We can't afford to do otherwise."

Yesterday he announced these sales figures:

Series E bonds, \$571,000,000—behind schedule.

Total individual sales, including E bonds, \$2,021,000,000—ahead of schedule and 40 per cent of the individual's quota of \$5,000,000,000.

Total sales including individuals and corporations, \$8,941,000,000—far ahead of schedule and more than half the total quota of \$14,000,000,000.

## Seabees in Need Of Men; Recruiter Dated in Roseburg

After a year's absence from the recruiting scene, the U. S. navy's famed Seabee construction battalions again have hung out the "Men Wanted—Urgent!" sign, and petty officer ratings again are available in the naval construction regiments to men who can qualify technically and physically, according to W. F. Patrie of the Roseburg navy recruiting office, who will be at

the Roseburg chamber of commerce office Dec. 8 and 9.

So rapid, the navy representative asserted, has been the United States' military progress in the Pacific that the originally authorized strength of the Seabees now is insufficient to keep pace with our advancing forces. Consequently, a major expansion of the navy's construction arm has just been approved.

Men 17 to 50, not in essential industry, may apply. Men in the upper age brackets who had had substantial experience in varied building trade skills may qualify for petty officer ratings. Procedure Stated.

The plan of voluntary induction has been re-opened to draft-

age men (18 to 38) who are not in deferred classifications due to essential work. Men interested in the new Seabee opportunities should, first of all, visit a navy recruiting station and determine their physical and technical qualifications and, if found acceptable and qualified for a rating, then should apply to their draft boards for voluntary induction. Men above draft age (38 to 50), may enlist voluntarily if qualified and if not engaged in essential industry.

The following trade skills now are urgently needed in the Seabees: draftsman, surveyor, stevedore, winchman, hatch boss, pipefitter, plumber, blacksmith, welder, rigger, crane patrol grader,

bulldozer and carry-all operator and electricians (line, station and general).

The primary job of the Seabee is to build and maintain advanced bases although they are trained to fight and equipped to protect themselves if need be.

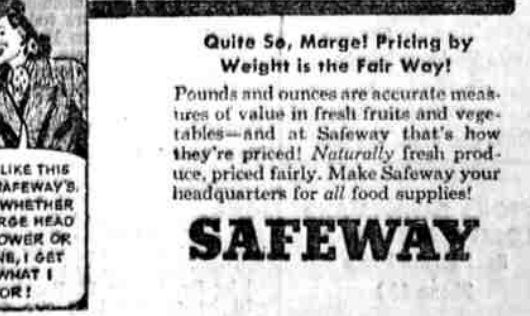
