Stronger Labor Dept. Advocated By Secy. Perkins

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12—(AP)—Secretary of Labor Perkins called today for a powerful post-war labor department, to include work now done by the War Labor board and the National Labor Relations board.

"Fixing of wages and prices should be abandoned as soon as possible and the various activities of the government in prevention of industrial disputes or their settlement should be permanently attached to the department of labor," said Miss Perkins in a speech prepared for the national conference on labor legislation.

Secretary Perkins herself has been rumored as being ready to quit, if the president can find a successor suitable to the AFL and CIO. Her resignation is understood to have been before Mr. Roosevelt for a long time.

"Adult education, insofar as it affects working people, should be lodged in the Labor department and a strong working conditions service should be developed there," Miss Perkins said.

"Various functions relating to labor matters now scattered through many agencies of the government, should be consolidated in the U. S. Department of Labor after the war," she continued, "including those of the employment service and the apprenticeship and occupational training service of the War Manpower commission and the labor planning-for-production program of the War Production board."
