MORE INDUSTRY COMING

THE report that 60 or more carloads of logs, lumber and piling are moving out of Douglas county daily indicates how rapidly our timber industry is expanding.

But this is only the beginning. Secretary Hickerson of the Roseburg chamber of commerce reports inquiries coming in daily for information from individuals and firms planning postwar operations in Douglas county.

A significant factor is seen in the shipment of peeler logs from Douglas county. Many carloads are going out daily to plywood plants in Oregon and Washington.

These operations cannot be economically maintained in the postwar period. As long as prices on lumber and plywood remain high, as a result of the war emergency...

Here in Douglas county our most serious concern is that of over-industrialization. Because a major part of our timber resources is under sustained yield management...

Undoubtedly, the postwar industry in Douglas county will be marked by the advent of many new types of by-product activities. This new field is still in the pioneering stage...

Coupled with mill and logging operations are supply firms, machine agencies and repair shops, accounting and insurance firms, and other business activities...
