Joan's Attorney Quotes Christ in Flaying Chaplin

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 29. — (AP) — Joan Berry's attorney appealed to the word of Christ today in justification of her relations with Charles Chaplin and told a jury in her paternity case against the comedian that "I feel we have here the man who is responsible for this baby's existence."

Joseph Scott, white haired churchman, declared that in the days of Moses, a woman caught in adultery was stoned to death, and recalled the incident in which such a one was taken before Christ in the temple.

"A lot of gray-haired old buzzards like Chaplin came up and demanded that she be stoned to death," Scott declared. "But Christ stooped and wrote in the sand those immortal words: 'Let him among you who is without sin cast the first stone at her,' and then to the woman added, 'go and sin no more.'"

That is the philosophy of Christ, of whom I am a humble follower," Scott characterized Chaplin as "a master mechanic in the art of seduction," and referred to Miss Berry as "a wretched girl, aflame with the glamor of Hollywood."

"This Chaplin has the effrontery to say that he gave her a lecture on spirituality. What does he know about spirituality, except below his waistline? Why, I knew him when he had no seat to his pants. Now he comes up here with his fine words and sports two butlers. This man, who admits that he debauched this girl, talks about fornication like he was ordering ham and eggs for breakfast."

"You must realize that this girl is of limited intelligence. She could not possibly in all her life have conceived the tragic story that she told."

"This fellow doesn't lie like a gentleman—he lies like a cheap Cockney cad," Scott said.
